Soul Food: Women's History Month By Bishop Hee-Soo Jung

March is an important month for women, marking it as Women's History Month and celebrating International Women's Day on March 8. These highlight the contributions of women to history and contemporary society as well as recognizing the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women.

As Christian people, this is a wonderful opportunity for us to reflect and honor both the named (187!) and unnamed women of the Bible. These are the women who have deeply impacted our spiritual development by their courage, faith, hope, actions, and words.

In the Old Testament, I reflect upon Queen Esther, whose story is about wisdom, courage, and the providence of God. Esther was an orphan raised by her uncle. She was chosen to be the Persian King's new queen. With that, Esther and her cousin, Mordecai, find themselves in roles that could prevent the genocide of the Jewish people, her people. Risking her life, she bravely confronts the king and thereby saves her people. When we need examples of bravery and courage, we can look to Esther! (See the book of Esther for the complete story).

In the New Testament, I am drawn to Luke 8:43-48, "Now there was a woman who had been suffering from hemorrhages for twelve years; and though she had spent all she had on physicians, no one could cure her. She came up behind Jesus and touched the fringe of his clothes, and immediately her hemorrhage stopped. Then Jesus asked, 'Who touched me?' When all denied it, Peter said, 'Master, the crowds surround you and press in on you.' But Jesus said, 'Someone touched me; for I noticed that power had gone out from me.' When the woman saw that she could not remain hidden, she came trembling; and falling down before him, she declared in the presence of all the people why she had touched him, and how she had been immediately healed. He said to her, 'Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace."

Here is an unnamed woman who had been suffering for twelve years with an illness. This woman was incurable, untouchable and an outcast. She was desperate for healing, wholeness, and connection. She knew that if she would just reach out to Jesus, she would be healed. What a testimony to the power of faith, relentless hope, and determination! Her healing is a reminder that everything is possible with Jesus.

There are many women throughout the Bible who inspire us; teach us how to overcome adversity; and remind us to keep our focus on God. As we celebrate Women's History month, let us keep in mind all the inspirational women from the Bible.

Spirit of God, we thank you for this time to remember, celebrate, and honor the women of the Bible. May their stories build within us a deep connection to you. Amen.

Dorcas Piecemakers: Our Circle group will be meeting the first and third Mondays of April from 1-3. We are working on new pillowcases for The Family Shelter in Polk County at this time. We are also going to put together a few baby quilts for missions in April.

Pastor's Pen: It's now April, and March was special for my family because we celebrated my wife's and son's birthdays. We worked hard to make cakes for them. I prepared a batter using eggs, butter, milk, cake flour, sugar, and vanilla extract. and baked it in a 325F oven for



about 35 minutes to make a genoise. Then, I used a machine to whip cream with some sugar to make a stiff cream for decorating the cake. My wife cut the genoise into three pieces, spread sugar syrup on each surface, placed strawberries on them, added the cream on top to shape the cake, and spread the cream all over to make a beautiful cake for my wife and son. You can probably see the pictures of the cakes we made. They're pretty, aren't they?





In March, also, something special happened in our parish - we had an in-person Lenten Bible Study for the first time since the pandemic started. The Soup Suppers were also prepared with love by each church, which I found impressive. As I serve three churches, I don't often get the chance to hear the stories of my parishioners, so this was a precious opportunity for me. My goal for the Bible Study was to listen to my church members' stories, so I put the time in the beginning for us to share our daily lives and spiritual training, such as Lectio Divina. Initially, it looked like some of you were hesitant to share, but gradually opened up and shared your thoughts and feelings freely. Thank you to all who participated, especially those who didn't miss a week. I hope this Lenten season was filled with God's grace for all of us, both spiritually and physically.

Finally, In March, our district had an important event called Bishop's Day Apart at Chetek UMC on March 23rd. Although the gathering was mostly led by pastors, three of our parishioners attended the event, which made me proud and grateful. I was able to see the connection between pastors and laity through their interest and love. I hope you continue to show steady interest and love for our parish, district, conference, and denomination. The event lasted from 9 am to 3:30 pm and included opening worship and a morning session focused on learning about what the beloved community is. We also had a chance to ask the Bishop questions and hear about the current situation of our conference after enjoying a delicious lasagna lunch.

According to the Bishop, the Wisconsin Conference of the UMC has 44 churches that are in the process of leaving the denomination, but not all members of those churches necessarily agree with the decision. So, the Conference is starting new UMCs in those areas for those who still want to stay within the UMC. There are many rumors about what's happening in the United Methodist Church, but nothing has been decided until the 2024 General Conference. The issue of LGBTQIA+ is just one of many topics to be discussed, and nothing has been decided yet. Regardless of what happens, it's important to continue your spiritual journey faithfully and not believe in inaccurate rumors. Please continue to show interest and love for the United Methodist Church by praying for it.



This April is the time when we celebrate the resurrection of Christ. The cold winter is passing, and the lively and vibrant spring is coming. I pray that the Holy Spirit within us will guide us on our journey of resurrection in faith.


