Pastor's Pen: I've seen a picture that says, "Travel East, Travel West, After all Home's Best." Like this saying, after our trip to Korea, we felt like this. Wisconsin has truly become our home. After the trip, we rested well and adjusted well to jet lag (time difference). During Evan's stay in Korea, I felt that he was even bigger. And one good thing is that Evan has started to speak in sentences now. Not only does he never stop running, but he also never stops asking questions: "Papa or mama, what is this? Why and why and why?" He is learning many things these days. So sometimes his expressions surprise us. It seems that we'll have to be careful what we say in front of him now. Esther and I are interested in Evan's education, so we recently bought books for him on Black Friday!

Kids, including Evan, seem to be growing up really fast. When I first came to Willow River Parish, the children of the parish were shorter than me, but it seems that some of them have now reached puberty, and are the same height as me or taller than me. I pray that all the children of our parish grow up healthy in Christ and be used as tools for the Kingdom of the Lord.

Isaiah 40:8 says: "The grass withers and the flowers fall, but the word of our God endures forever." There are many kinds of growth in this world. And each growth has its right time. Children are in a period of physical growth, so they need to eat well, play well, and sleep well. And some scientists say most people's physical growth doesn't happen after age 25. After age 25, they say, aging begins. But other than physical growth, there is an area where we need to grow during our lifelong journey. This is called spiritual growth.

We can easily know if a child is growing well or not because we can measure their height and weight. However, unlike physical growth, spiritual growth is invisible, so it is not easy to know whether we are growing properly spiritually. Unlike physical growth, spiritual growth has no limits. We can try to grow to approach God's holiness until the day we return to God. Therefore, we must always carefully watch whether we are spiritually healthy and growing properly. In that sense, the season of Advent is a great opportunity for us to take care of our souls.

Church tradition uses purple or blue as the pulpit color twice a year: a season of Lent and a season of Advent. FYI, these colors symbolize repentance. Advent is also a season of waiting. We are waiting for the return of the Lord with hope and anticipation. During this season, we also need to reflect on our lives such as how we lived this year, which parts were good, or which parts need improvement.

I hope that all of you wrap up this year well by having candles for Advent in your homes, lighting them, and praying for your family, your neighbors, and for your spiritual health and growth.

Gratitude for Re-Assignment by Bishop Hee-Soo Jung: Each day begins with blessing, movement, and the increase of light.

The blessings of life we experience in Wisconsin are no less than amazing. God's transformative ways are unstoppable and present with each passing day. In God's abundant grace we share this experience of life together in relationships that make known Jesus the Christ.

After the close of the North Central Jurisdictional Conference, I gave thanks as I saw God's relentless solidarity with the United Methodist Church moving us in power and love and leading us into the future.

At a time when the uncertainties of the denomination and with more challenges of the pandemic were still vivid, I could not foresee what the Conference would be like. I prayed fervently for the Holy Spirit to move powerfully so that peace and justice might prevail.

All of us at the Conference tasted the atmosphere of God's Spirit refining our identity with hearts strangely warmed.

It was great faith and imagination for the kin-dom of God that surfaced the best of us, and it was beautiful to see the North Central Jurisdictional Conference raise wise leaders, electing three gifted bishops among us.

It was a special grace to experience no obstacles put in the way of those who love the Lord to seriously discuss the challenges and dialogue about all that is before us, seeking the Lord's will. It was a week of learning about anti-racism, LGBTQIA+ exclusion, a week of hearts humbled by stories of our life together discerning the greater will of God. With the scriptural theme of Philippians 3:14 and 'Press On,' we left with the determination

to press on seeking the kingdom of God and Christ-like Christian community.

I always call the Wisconsin Conference and its leaders, 'Beautiful People.' It's not rhetorical, I call it that because I see a holistic, united, and beautiful community. I am so grateful to be re-assigned as your bishop. I am humbled by your trust. Once again, the delegation representing our Wisconsin Conference showed great unity in prayer and gifts for building up the whole church.

It was powerfully inspiring to see one of our clergy, Rev. Dan Schwerin, elected as a bishop, and to see the widespread support for his leadership. This was a deep affirmation of the ministry we share across our annual conference of which we are all servants.

Now let's pray as he and Julie go to serve the Northern Illinois Conference where he will serve as a bishop. We are reminded again that we must be the ones who respond to the call of Christ, that all of us are called by God and equipped wherever we are sent to serve whether that be in a classroom or kitchen or playground.

The Lord is calling us--urging us to live a life as servants and stewards, so that the world can know the gospel, and experience God's Shalom. The church is calling us to stand up for peace in a world of alienation and sorrow.

Please receive my gratitude and respect. We thank God that we will serve as your episcopal servant for the next two years. We appreciate your prayers and love for me and my wife, Im. We are blessed to live among you. The Church is of God and will prevail as a humble instrument to heal and serve. There will be a celebration for Bishop Schwerin in a service of worship on Saturday, December 17, 11am, at First UMC Waukesha, 121 Wisconsin Ave., Waukesha, WI 53186. Refreshments will follow. 


