1st Quarter Noisy Can--Grace Place

Pastor's Pen: Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18)

It's January and it's the first month of 2023. It seems that many people tend to want to have new plans and new year's resolutions when the new year begins. My family and I had a good Christmas at home, and we joined the WI Korean Caucus Family Retreat in Madison from the 26th through 27th. We had a worship service there with Korean clergies and their families who serve churches in our conference, and listened to a seminar themed on "Faith, Church, and Post-Pandemic."



At the retreat, an instructor read 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18, and asked everyone: "Did you make new year's resolutions? If you could make one sentence including resolutions for the new year, what would it be? I will give you five minutes and you make one sentence for the new year by using the three words: 'Rejoice,' 'pray,' and 'give thanks.' You can use all three or just one or two words."

Esther and I discussed this, and she formulated our family's one sentence: "During 2023, be a family who prays, is always grateful, and strives to please God." Isn't it good?

I would like to offer you the same suggestion. Please read 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 first, and then make your new year's sentence by using the words 'Rejoice,' 'pray,' and 'give thanks.' Of course, you can rephrase these words like we did.



The biggest concern in my family these days is 'sourdough'. A while ago we had Evan's 1,000 days old celebration and we made a cake for him. And I can say it was successful. So, after gaining confidence in baking, we decided to make sourdough this time. But unlike cake, making sourdough doesn't

seem easy and simple.

To make sourdough, we need to make a sourdough starter first. It needs flour, water, proper air and temperature, and patience. According to experts, it takes about 7-14 days for the starter to be made. In the meantime, we need to feed the starter every day with flour and water. We tried to make each starter. I used unbleached all-purpose flour and Esther used wholewheat flour. However, making the starter was harder than I imagined. After four days of making the starter, mine was separated between flour and water and began to give off an unpleasant smell. Experts say that a well-made starter has a sour and sweet smell, not a stink. Unfortunately, mine had to go in the trash. And, I'm hoping and praying that her starter will mature into a good starter that can make delicious sourdough.

I learned that there were smell and color differences between an unprepared starter and a good starter. And above all, a good starter floats on water, but an unprepared starter sinks to the bottom.

I think sourdough starter has something in common with our spirituality. All people have spirituality, but some have a healthy and mature spirituality, and some don't. The lives of God's people with healthy and mature spirituality have beautiful traces and beautiful scents of life.



In the new year, I pray in the name of the Lord that your life will be filled with

'gratitude,' 'prayer,' 'joy,' and 'beautiful traces and scents of life.'


