Dear WRP Family,

Grace and peace of our Lord be with you all.

I pray that God's abundant grace and peace overflow in your lives. As we prepare to begin the 2025–2026 Confirmation, I would like to ask for your continued prayers. It would have been wonderful to begin in September, but I

have been in recovery from hernia surgery. Though I am not yet fully recovered, I have decided to move forward in faith and begin this year's Confirmation with courage and trust in the Lord. Please keep me and our confirmands in your supportive prayers so that we may complete this journey well.

Recently, we held a parent meeting regarding Confirmation, and both the parents and I were very excited. Drawing on past experiences and areas I felt could be strengthened, I've made several improvements to provide a more meaningful and well-rounded Confirmation program this year. I believe that Confirmation is a precious time for our confirmands to deepen their understanding of their faith and their church. Those who help guide them on this journey of faith are their mentors.

With more detailed guidelines this year, each confirmand will embark on a deeper spiritual journey together with their mentor. Some of the confirmands and their parents may approach you to ask if you would serve as a mentor. I kindly ask you to prayerfully and positively accept their requests and to walk with them faithfully throughout the year.

This year, our confirmands are Vidalia, Michael, Oliver, Gracie, Baylie, and Jordyn. Please keep each of them in your prayers as they grow in faith, learn about the church, and deepen their relationship with Christ.

To help our confirmands learn more deeply about their church and its traditions, they will participate in various projects and ministries. For example, they will attend Church Council meetings and will be encouraged to share their opinions. They will also participate in SPRC meetings. When I visit nursing homes or make home visitations, they will accompany me. In addition, they will serve as liturgists and communion servers during worship.

Furthermore, I do not believe the pastor should be the only speaker during Confirmation. When multiple voices come together, our Confirmation experience becomes much richer. Therefore, I plan to invite members who serve in leadership roles within the church to speak with our confirmands—sharing about their ministries and how they live out their faith through service.

Lastly, I am thrilled to announce the beginning of our Confirmation Choir! Doesn't that sound exciting? This intergenerational choir—made up of confirmands, parents, mentors, and the pastor—will offer a special musical performance during the fifth-Sunday Parish Combined Worship Service. Our next combined service will be a special Hymn Sing Service on November 30 at Deer Park (10AM), and that will likely be the first time you will get to see the Confirmation Choir in action.

Please continue to encourage, pray for, and support this ministry. I hope that through this Confirmation journey—something we are all creating together—our parish will be filled with renewed energy and joy.

Letter from Bishop Schwerin: Something to Pray and Consider

Can you place the words below? Do they sound familiar, or are they new to you?

"We affirm the dignity, worth, and rights of migrants, immigrants, and refugees, including displaced and stateless people. In so doing, we acknowledge that the world today is facing an unprecedented crisis related to the displacement of vast numbers of people due to such factors as ongoing wars and other hostilities, foreign interventions, widespread famine and hunger, global warming and climate change, and the failure of nation-states to adequately protect and care for their people.

We recognize that displaced people are particularly vulnerable as their in-between status often provides them with few protections and benefits, leaving them open to exploitation, violence, and abuse. We urge United Methodists to welcome migrants, refugees, and immigrants into their congregations and to commit themselves to providing concrete support, including help with navigating restrictive and often lengthy immigration policies, and assistance with securing food, housing, education, employment, and other kinds of support.

We oppose our laws and policies that attempt to criminalize, dehumanize, or punish displaced individuals and families based on their status as migrants, immigrants, or refugees. Additionally, we decry attempts to detain displaced people and hold them in inhumane and unsanitary conditions. We challenge policies that call for the separation of families, especially parents and minor children, and we oppose the existence of for-profit detention centers for such purposes.", (2020/2024 Book of Discipline, para. 163.G, pp. 143-144).

As we entered 2025, I asked both conferences in our area to practice a year of grace, a Wesleyan candle in the wind of the world. As we look toward 2026, I am asking us to pray and consider a year of practicing hope. I would offer the above section of our 2020/2024 *Book of Discipline* as a matter of prayer, study, support for teaching, and seeds for our practice of hope in this moment. Read it weekly. Pray about what rises in your spirit. Let it lead you to prayer and action. Modest churches, small churches, large churches, and all people can choose to practice hope. In doing so, we will not be alone.

May the peace of Christ be in our steps.


